

ESAHEC Housing Regulations

The Eastern Shore AHEC will provide housing to students while completing rotations on the Eastern Shore. We want your stay to be a rewarding and positive experience. To accommodate your stay, we ask your cooperation so that we may continue to offer safe, clean and affordable housing to students. Your part in making our effort complete is to assist in minimum housekeeping duties and to obey the following rules.

1. NO smoking in the buildings.
2. NO pets are allowed.
3. Students are responsible for cleaning of sleeping area and you share in keeping the whole apartment clean.
4. At the end of a rotation, a cleaning fee will be assessed if the apartment is not cleaned or if we have to make special arrangements to have someone clean up above and beyond accepted standards of cleanliness. If necessary, we will work with the University to assess damages due to your negligence.
5. If an item is broken, please notify the Center's office. We will determine the proper way to fix or replace the item.
6. Please be considerate of others in matters of noise level, cleanliness and in general day to day living.
7. It is each student's responsibility to turn in your apartment keys to the Clinical Education Coordinator and for paying any fees you may owe.
8. All maintenance issues related to the apartment should be referred to the apartment maintenance department to the rental office.
9. You are responsible for laundering your own towels and linens and to keep the apartment clean. A vacuum cleaner has been provided for your use.
10. If you use AHEC linens and towels, you are asked to make sure that they are laundered before you leave. Those students who have in house washer and dryers units will be supplied with detergents and those students (Cambridge) who have to use washer and dryers outside of the apartment will be supplied with detergents and a roll of quarters, (\$10.00), to use for this purpose. Please remember that if you do not leave laundered linens, the next student will have the responsibility to clean up after you.
11. All policies of the University apply to this housing. Inquire at the AHEC if you have questions.
12. Telephone has been provided for local calls only. If you have long distance needs, please use your cell phone or calling card.
13. Call 911 if there is an emergency or life threatening situation
14. All apartments will be stocked with toilet tissue, paper towels, and various cleaning supplies upon your arrival. If you run out of supplies, please restock appropriately.
15. If students have guests stay overnight, students are responsible for conduct and will be liable for any breakage and/or repairs.
16. If it is necessary for Center staff to enter a student's apartment, every attempt will be made to provide advance notification of entry.

Remember:

If repairs or remedies are needed to the apartment equipment, call the apartment office or maintenance department.
